#### New affordable accommodation

As homelessness continues to rise in Bristol, we continue to look for ways to expand our accommodation in order to help more people. With land costs and house prices rising, we're looking for innovative solutions for expansion.

During an informal chat with local architect Craig White, Jessica (our Chief Executive) asked whether it might be feasible to build upwards to add accommodation to the roof of Backfields House. This building, which we own, is the centre of our operations. It hosts our office, warehouse, workshops, our biggest shop, and our business incubator.

An innovative, light-weight eco-home system called a TAM (Transportable Accommodation Module) was designed by Craig specifically to fit into odd spaces in our city: on roof tops, at the side of semi-detached houses and in back gardens.

TAMs are produced locally, giving Companions an opportunity to get involved in both building the units off-site and fitting them out on-site.


Homes England, a non-departmental government body, has provided funding for a feasibility study and, if feasible, to submit a planning application and produce detailed design drawings. We now know that the project is technically feasible and are beginning work on financial viability. We also need to compare TAM costs to building from scratch, and to buying and converting an existing building as we did with Shaftesbury House, our communal accommodation.

We're continuing to explore other, quicker ways of expanding our accommodation, such as leasing from private landlords and the local council, to help more people out of homelessness.

## Turning goals into realities

Although Emmaus Bristol offers a home for as long as it's needed, we're always pleased when Companions¹ feel they are ready to move on to independent living outside of our community – we support them throughout this process.

#### Moving on

Other Companions opt to take a step forward within our community by choosing interdependent living in Emmaus Bristol's 'move on' houses. In contrast to life in our 21-bedroom communal home, in these smaller 3–4 person houses Companions have more day-to-day responsibilities such as sharing chores and buying food.

#### Tailored support and training

We never forget the invisible barriers to moving on from homelessness. Trauma is one issue that can hold back many people who have been homeless. Our Support Team works hard to find and introduce Companions to services and therapies that can help resolve past difficulties, and empower individuals to see their future and pursue their goals.

Those goals include acquiring academic qualifications, or vocational certifications, in order to gain better employment and afford to move out comfortably into the economically challenging Bristol environment.

Companions are encouraged to recognise how enhanced work skills are key to finding secure, better-paid work which safeguards us all against the likelihood of poverty and homelessness.

Many Companions are taking advantage of the excellent employment training, advice, and placements that our Support Staff arrange through West of England Works and N-gage Training. One Companion is currently training for forklift truck certification, another Companion is taking a word processing course, and a third has completed courses to boost their confidence.

Experienced IT mentor and dedicated Emmaus Bristol volunteer, Kevin Brown is always available to help Companions write CVs and apply for work online.

However, personal development is not only about academic or vocational qualifications – it's also about having fun and learning for pleasure. Companions are taking writing courses, learning Hindi, attending conferences and concerts, local music nights, national Emmaus planning events and volunteering locally.

From high-level computer qualifications to medical anatomy courses, Companions are getting ready to move on.

We recently heard from a former Companion who has found work in Bristol and moved into his own digs. He told us he is very grateful to Emmaus Bristol, and that he loves his new home and 'still' enjoys his job!

#### More than just a 'job well done'

Our House Clearance team regularly receives high praise from customers who've used the Emmaus Bristol House Clearance Service. This is always a real boost for our team members, many of whom have lost confidence due to the challenges and stigma homelessness brings.

#### Sensitive to customers' needs

Often our customers need to clear a property due to a family bereavement. The task of sorting through a loved one's personal effects is invariably emotionally challenging. Equally daunting is inviting a team of people into a home to pack and remove items that hold memories and represent shared experience. Our experienced House Clearance team are sensitive to bereavement, work respectfully, and as unobtrusively as possible to clear a property.

#### Minimising waste

The work of the House Clearance team continues after the last item is removed from the property. Back at the Emmaus Bristol yard, every van load is sorted through and separated, firstly into items suitable for re-use and re-sale in our shops, and then items that can be recycled. The team works to break down items to strip out any recyclable



materials such as wood or metal springs in furniture. In this way we significantly reduce the amount of waste going to landfill.

Emmaus Bristol offers a professional and courteous service that acknowledges both our customers' circumstances and environmental concerns, as well as providing opportunities for our team of Companions to move on from homelessness.

# Freedom of movement

Earlier this year we were loaned an electric bike (e-bike) by TravelWest. It proved so popular with Companions that we have just made the decision to buy our own 'pool' bike which may be used by any member of our team. We've been encouraging everyone to cycle or walk, both as our contribution to improving the environment and to improve personal fitness and well-being.

"I have found the electric bike really valuable. Having access to the bike means I can go further afield. I can get to places I'd normally need a car to go to, or expensive travel, and see friends I might not have the opportunity to visit without it. The main benefit for me is feeling safe when cycling on the nearby bike trail: if I pass a group of people I'm anxious about, I know that on the e-bike I have the speed to escape potential problems regardless of how tired I am.

E-cycling has opened up a more active social life, allowed me to connect with the outside world, and means I can also go out to see a friend in the evening if I want to. That is a real gift."
